Role Purpose

The Housing Stabilization Officer plays a central role in helping residents achieve long-term housing stability, wellbeing, and community belonging.

Working closely with residents, the Community Resident Manager, Property Management, and community partners, this position provides early intervention, coordinated supports, resident orientation and education, and strengths-based case management to promote successful tenancies and resident success.

Key Responsibilities

This role combines housing stabilization, resident support, community partnerships, and resident education to strengthen housing stability and build resilient communities.

Resident Housing Stability & Support

- Conduct housing stabilization assessments and develop individualized support plans.
- Identify early indicators of housing instability and provide timely intervention.
- Assist residents in accessing housing stabilization programs and available community resources.



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- Develop repayment agreements and monitor resident progress through ongoing follow-up.
 - Promote resident self-determination, accountability, and long-term housing success.

Resident Advancement & Community Connections

- Connect residents with financial counselling, employment supports, income assistance, settlement services, and other community resources.
- Promote financial literacy, budgeting, savings, and resident capacity-building initiatives.
- Encourage resident participation in community activities that foster belonging, inclusion, and wellbeing.

Collaboration & Community Partnerships

- Work collaboratively with Property Management to address tenancy concerns before they escalate.
- Coordinate supports with community agencies and referral partners.
- Build positive working relationships that strengthen resident outcomes and community wellbeing.

Program Administration & Accountability

- Maintain accurate and confidential resident records and case documentation.
- Monitor service timelines and resident progress.
- Prepare reports and maintain documentation in accordance with organizational policies and funding requirements.
- Contribute to the continuous improvement of Inuka's Housing Stabilization Program.

Resident Orientation, Education & Capacity Building

- Coordinate and facilitate resident orientation in collaboration with the Community Resident Manager.
- Introduce residents to Inuka's Belong, Build, Thrive framework, available supports, and community expectations.

- Deliver or coordinate educational workshops and one-on-one coaching that promote housing stability, financial wellbeing, and successful community living.

Qualifications & Requirements

- Degree or diploma in Social Work, Human Services, Community Development, or a related field, or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
- Minimum three years' experience in housing stabilization, social services, case management, or community development.
- Knowledge of housing stabilization, eviction prevention, and community resources.
- Strong communication, organization, and problem-solving skills.
- Experience working with diverse communities using a strengths-based and culturally responsive approach.
- Working knowledge of Microsoft 365.
- Ability to build collaborative relationships with residents, community partners, and service providers.

Working Conditions

- Office and community-based position with regular resident interaction.
- Occasional evening and weekend work may be required.
- Local travel within Winnipeg may be required.
- Must maintain a satisfactory Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Sector Check.
- This is a full-time, 12-month contract position funded through a multi-year program. The position is intended to be renewed annually, subject to continued funding, organizational needs, and satisfactory performance.
